tolen Motor vehicles continue to plague both owners and the insurance industry. However, there is indication that the practice is trending downwards. Statistics in relation to the incidence of stolen vehicles are based on claims made to Insurance Companies.

For the period 2010-2012 a total of 3,035 vehicles were stolen comprising 1,080 in 2010, 1,048 in 2011 and 907 in 2012. It is noticeable that in 2012 the figure of 907 was 173 below that of 2010, which is certainly a move in the right direction.

Where make of vehicles is concerned, 532 Toyotas were stolen in 2010 against 471 in 2012. The number of Honda stolen in 2012 was 136 against 169 stolen in 2010 and for Nissan 160 were stolen in 2012 against 173 in 2010. While other models have been stolen, Toyota, Nissan and Honda emerge to be the top three reported stolen. The overall theft per day is approximately 2.5.

There have been reported incidents in which motor vehicles have been reported stolen with valuable documents, computers, and other valuable articles. When leaving vehicles unattended, even for a brief moment, it is advisable to take every precaution to avoid the vehicle being stolen. Most vehicles that are stolen have occurred in quick time. Here are some hints to remember:
